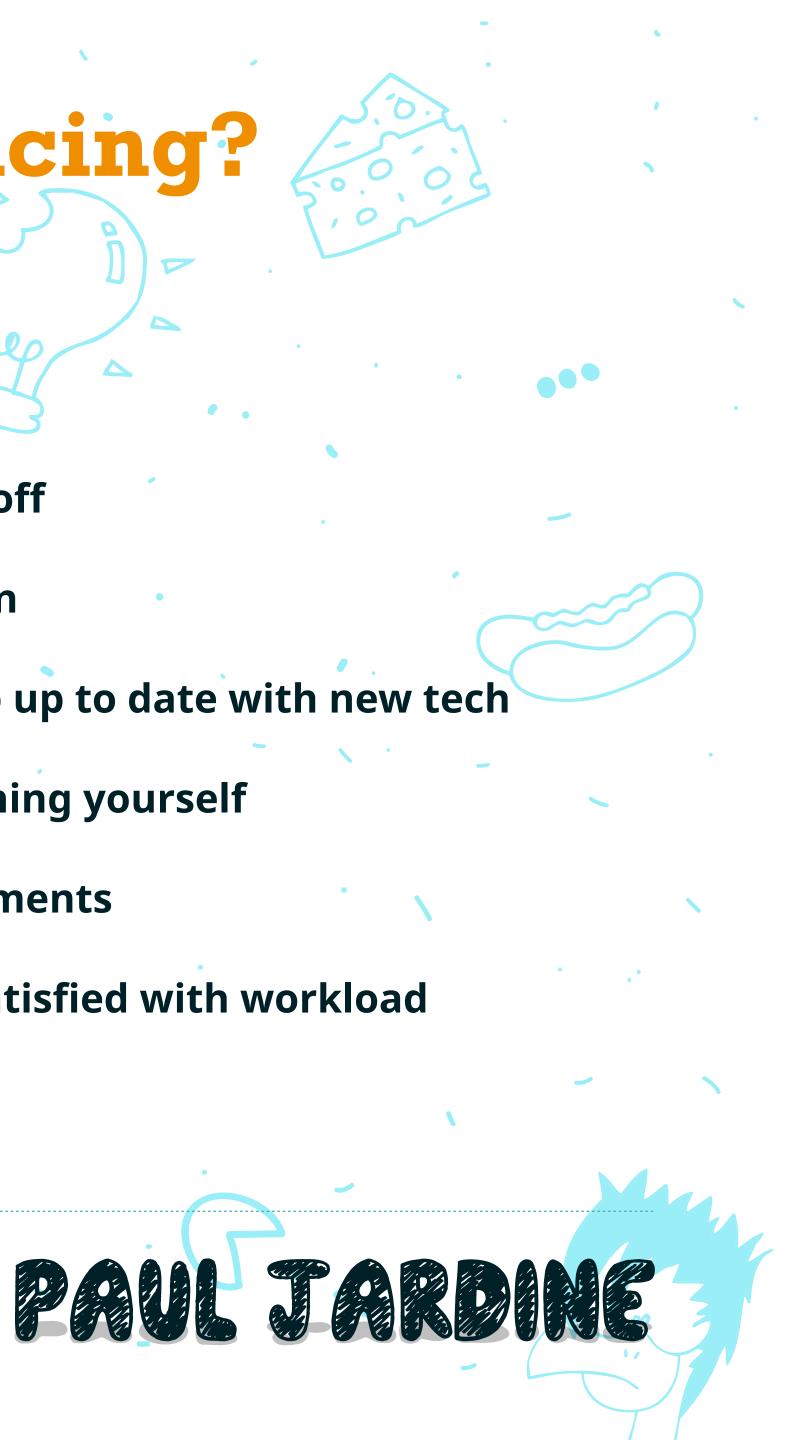

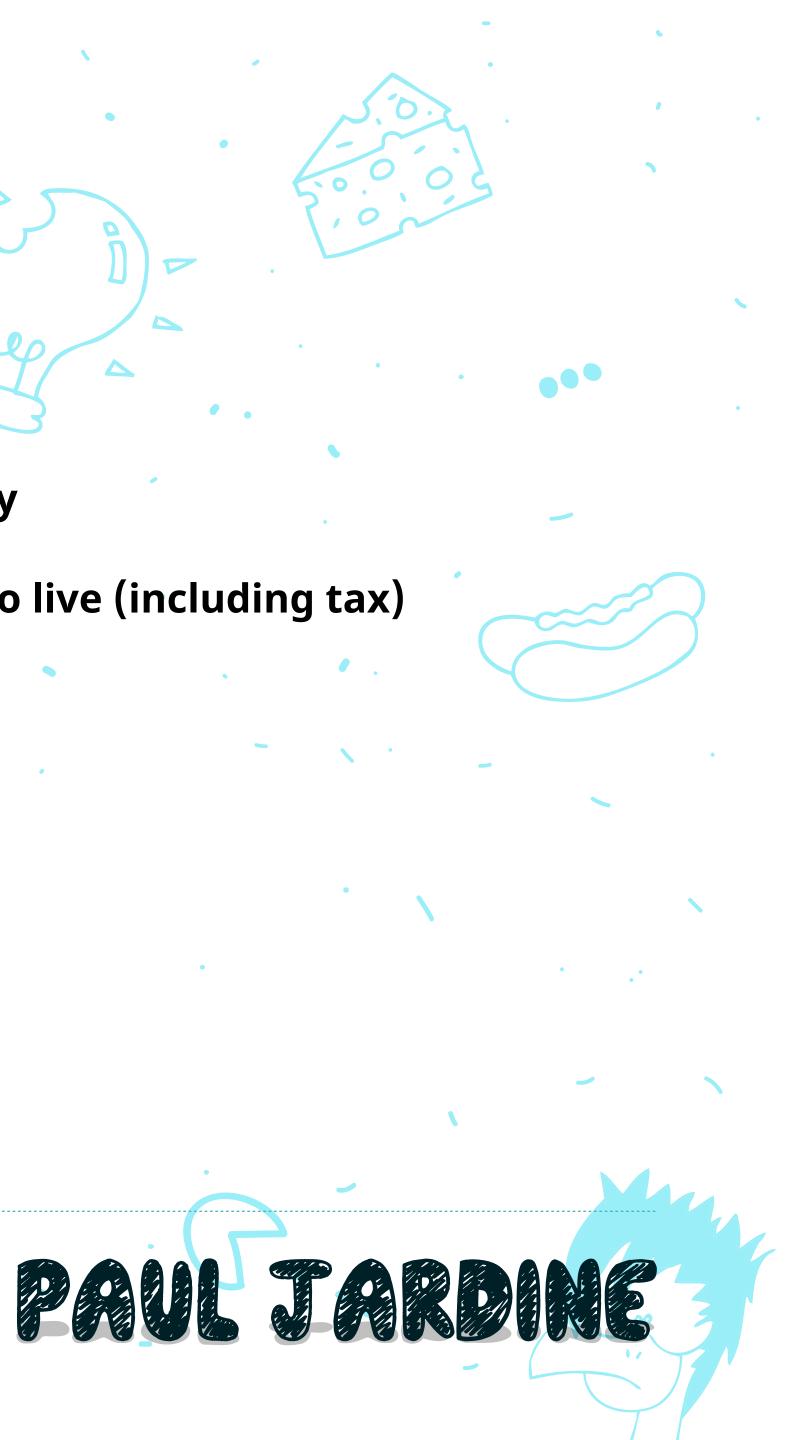


# Money








- Stay in control!

# Managing Your Cash Flow

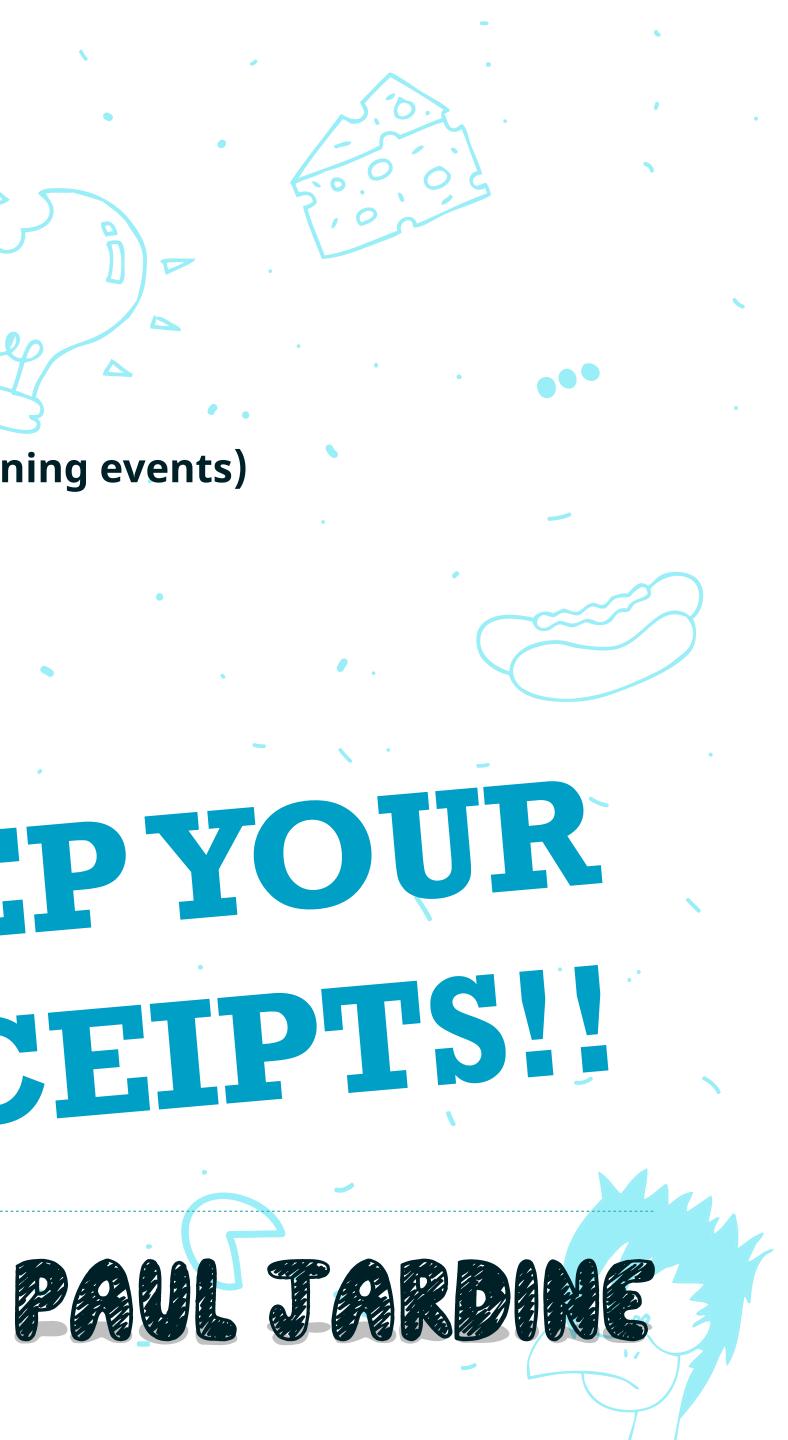

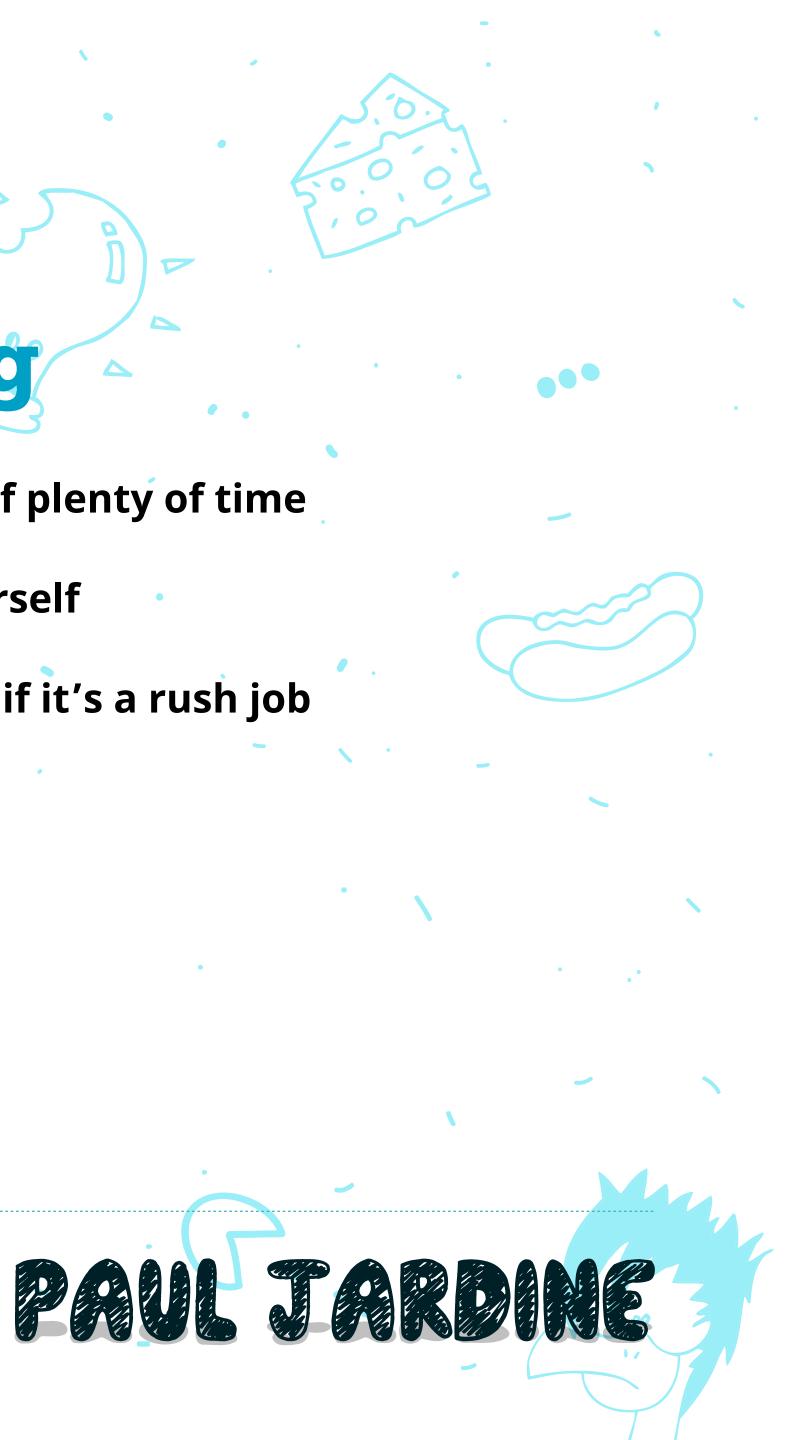
